1. Schools and Colleges access via You Tube.
2. Children under the age of 18 can only access via a registration by their teacher, tutor, or careers adviser for safeguarding reasons.
3. Schools and colleges will be able to project the live stream onto whiteboards and questions, are asked via the live chat.
4. For those who are working remotely/blended learning you can share your screen via your usual virtual meeting platform with young people accessing the sessions from home.
5. Young people aged 18 and older are able to register in their own right.
6. More than 30 maritime organisations are exhibiting, each will be making 25 minute live presentations including Q and A.
7. You will have access to an overview web page listing all participating organisations, times of and links to their live presentations. Each organisation also has its own virtual 'stall' webpage, where you will be able to access LMI information about them, along with other useful information including links to their website or videos.
8. From these virtual stalls you will be able to make decisions about which live sessions to access.
9. Final lists of employers will be confirmed on Monday 12th October
10. We will also have information available about Apprenticeships.
11. A member of the Solent LEP team will be in every session for support.
12. Please do support the promotion of your involvement in the event within your own networks and on social media. Please feel free to use the digital resources which you can find by [clicking here](#).
13. You can use resources for providing evidence of Gatsby Benchmark 5 to prove meaningful encounters with employers, we have supporting [Videos](#), [Careers Brochure](#) and [Lesson Plans](#).
14. The whole event will be recorded and clipped for use on the Maritime UK website afterwards.

A survey will be distributed after the event, and would ask that you complete this, as so that we can measure how many young people accessed the event.

We hope that you will be able to join us on the 14 October and that this event will aid your students and pupils in their own career development learning.
